Is It Worth It?

Do you ever wonder if it's worth it? The effort, I mean. I just spent several hours helping my new 9th grader organize folders and notebooks for high school. As we finished, the thought struck me that it won't be more than a month and those folders and notebooks will be tattered and he won't be able to find anything in his "organizational system" because...well, because he's 13. Was it worth it to put all that time into it and to walk him through the process of organization?

We all wonder if it's worth it from time to time. But this past week I was reminded that what we do, specifically as SpringHouse, is worth it. Because SpringHouse is a thingbecause we came together in this place and turned Salem's old building into a ministry center-we make a difference.

I was in my office last Thursday morning when Laurie Z called down to me and told me there was someone in the office who wanted to see me. When I came up, I encountered a gentleman, outfitted in a bright construction vest, waiting patiently-yet impatiently. He shook my hand and introduced himself and said, "I guess this is kinda my church...You know I come here every Sunday night for my NA meeting, and I just didn't have anywhere else to go." He proceeded to tell me that his wife and kids got a flat tire over by the lake and they were \$16 short of the towing fee. If he couldn't come up with it, the police were going to tow it to the impound lot. He said he could come and repay me in less than an hour, but would have to drive home to Fridley to get it and come back. (Then we tangentially bonded over both growing up in Fridley.)

Thanks to the your generous donations, I happened to have some cash in the locked cabinet that was due to be used for gift cards and the pastoral discretionary fund. He was on the phone with his wife while the police officer and the tow truck driver impatiently waited to find out if he could quickly come

up with the cash. As I handed him a \$20 bill, he told her he would be right there and I heard her exclaim, "I love you! Thank you!" to us through the phone.

As he hurried out the door, he said he would be back as soon as he could and I simply said, "Don't worry about it, it's our gift to you. I'm glad you felt you could come to us. Maybe we will see you on a Sunday evening."

His final words were, "God bless you." I responded in kind. Then he took off to rescue his poor wife and kids.

Do you ever wonder if it's worth it? I do. But every once in a while I am reminded that while most of the time we may never see our seeds bear fruit or our work make a differenceevery so often we get to see a glimpse of its worth.

I guess I might never know if the things Clark and I did together to get ready for 9th grade will be worth it. But I can hope.

As we jump into September and begin a new program year, as we gear up for changes and for new things to come, let's remember that what we do matters. Our effort is worth it. Our church makes a difference. In big and little ways, with the Spirit leading us and with God's blessing in our work...it is worth it.

Look What We Did!

Last spring we received \$2673 for our Seasons of Giving focus on summer ministries. Here is what we did...

- Helped send 4 of our Salem youth to Camp Wapo in Amery WI for an entire week. God showed up and I hope you will ask them about their experiences when you see them!
- Supported our South Minneapolis Day Camp in June. Above and beyond our normal contributions, we helped proved many of the items necessary for the kids to make 165 hospice kits for Global Health. (We asked families to bring items, but with the number of items needed for each kit, we needed to purchase a majority of the items to make this project happen, without Salem, they would have had to pick a different project.) All this means that almost 100 children learned from Roger Livdahl about people in Africa who need hospice kits and then made kits to send to them...and 165 people on the other side of the world will find comfort in items packed in a zip lock on a summer afternoon in June.
- Supported our SpringHouse servant trip to Detroit by helping pay for transportation that was used to get to and from our daily projects and we helped to pay part of the cost of the trip for Pastor Rhonda and Clark...all of which helped our SpringHouse group complete almost 40 projects with homeowners in Detroit that will make a difference in several neighborhoods and the families who live there!

Sheridan Story


Looking for a fun and easy volunteer opportunity on Friday afternoons? Our partner in SpringHouse, First Christian Church, has launched a partnership with Whittier International School and the Sheridan Story program and would love to have some Salem members join them as volunteers. The Sheridan Story program, started in 2010 at Sheridan elementary, partners with hunger relief organizations, corporations, and other churches and organizations to provide food for "food insecure" students to take home for the weekend. Mikah Meyer at St. Paul-Reformation Church

Join Today Show-featured Lutheran pastor's kid and National Cathedral countertenor singer, Mikah Meyer, at St. Paul-Reformation Lutheran (100 N. Oxford Street, St. Paul) on



September 22 at 7 pm for a cabaret performance of songs, humorous stories, and soul-stirring messages from his nonstop, 3-year road trip to all 417 National Park Service sites. As heard on NPR, Mikah has spent the past 2.5 years living in a cargo van while setting a world record as the youngest person to visit the entirety of the National Park System. He's been using the media attention to share a carpe diem message inspired by his father's passing from cancer, to break stereotypes about LGBT people, and to foster acceptance for LGBT Christians. To keep this project going he "sings for his supper" at churches across the United States, such as this freewill offering concert, to allow this ministry to complete its goals. Stay around afterwards, as Mikah will answer your questions on the parks and his missions!



AMMPARO Migrant Children

The word "amparo" in Spanish means the protection of a living creature from suffering or damage. The ELCA's strategy to Accompanying Migrant Minors with Protection, Advocacy, Representation and Opportunities (AMMPARO) was envisioned after witnessing the plight of children who are forced to flee their communities because of complex and interrelated reasons, including chronic violence, poverty, environmental displacement and lack of opportunities in Central America. Due to our connection to companion churches in the region, including companion synod relationships, and existing ministries in the U.S., the ELCA is well-positioned to help ensure that these vulnerable children are protected.

As brothers and sisters in Christ, the ELCA is called to bear witness to the conditions affecting so many communities and to work to find solutions that will acknowledge the humanity in all of God's children. Join us in making a difference in the lives of vulnerable children and families.

Ways for parents to support their children in the Godly Play program.

Below is a partial exert from the Complete Guide to Godly Play (Volume 2) by Jerome Berryman.

- Follow the schedule as faithfully as you can, arriving in time for the children to be relaxed.
- It is best to say good-bye to your children at the doorway so the door person can help children enter the room appropriately.
- It is also best not to hover at the doorway. Once your child enters the room, he or she will be safe. The mentors may be volunteers, but they are well trained.
- When you pick up your children, they may not be able to describe the day's lesson in words. They are not asked to memorize a summary or a Bible verse. They are invited to wonder together what the lesson means and how it is important for their lives. Much of the significant communication in the room is nonverbal, and the history of the Christian tradition is full of teachings about how the mystery of God's presence is difficult to express.
- Please wait to enter the room until after the session so that the room can remain for the children..
