A New Year Has Begun

As you read this, we are in the third week of the year and if you made a new year's resolution, I pray that it is working for you. But, if you are like most people -statistically speaking- your new year's resolution may have already come to its end. Science has determined that the day by which most resolutions bite the dust is January 12. So if you are still going strong, you are above the curve.

The new year always brings a lot of pressure...for individuals or communities. What will we do differently? How will we be better? What if, instead of trying to figure out how we will be better this year, we took the lens of gratitude and spent time reflecting on how we were already better last year? But because I am running out of space, and because we have our annual meeting coming up in less than two weeks, I am going to table the revelation of good news and blessings. I can think of no better place to celebrate the light, the ways we are better and stronger, and the ways we put darkness in it's place, than at our annual celebration of ministry. As for those new year's resolutions? If they work for you-fantastic! If they don't, I would invite you not to sweat it...they don't work for most of us. 

SpringHouse Joint Servant Trip Cheyenne River Reservation Spiritual Healing Horse Ministry

Join us as we travel west to Bridger, SD and meet our Lakota neighbors! We have been invited to experience an amazing ministry that centers on young adults and



horses at The Horse Ministry Program. The program draws upon Lakota knowledge and tradition and is a refuge and healing space for at-risk youth and young adults.

"Horse Ministry is not teaching youth how to ride a horse, it's about teaching people that are hurting how to reconnect to the spirit." Toni Buffalo (founder)

Our time will be spent building relationships, learning about Lakota history, traditions, and life, participating in work projects, working with the people and horses in the program (there will be an opportunity for each of us to choose to ride), and of course—having fun!

Here is what you need to know to participate:

- Who? This servant opportunity is open to ALL (youth and adult) members of SpringHouse.
- When? We are set to leave after worship on <u>Sunday July 7</u> and return <u>Saturday evening July 13</u>.
- Cost? We have some planning yet to do, but anticipate that the total cost will not exceed \$350 per person. *If cost is an issue, know that there are scholarships available.
- When and how do I sign up? 
Support Families in Sanctuary
