

When we lose a loved one, grief can turn our daily routine inside out. While everyone responds to death in different ways, one thing remains constant: the ongoing support of family, friends and those who understand loss helps us heal. Founded in 1997, the Downtown Coalition for Grief Support is a non-profit group that offers support for metro adults who are dealing with the death of a family member, friend, or partner. The group is managed entirely by volunteers and trained facilitators from nine sponsoring Minneapolis congregations. The weekly meetings are free and open to the public, regardless of religious affiliation.

from LSS for worship on one of our Sundays and we will explore the many great things this fantastic organization is doing.


