Learning to Share

Learning to share is hard. I did not really understood how hard it is to share until I became a parent. Oh, I remember being a young child and having real feelings about sharing things with my little brother, sure. But it wasn't until I had my own toddler that I really saw the agonizing process that learning to share really is. I can still picture Clark's tiny fists clenched at his side, his face scrunched into as angry of a face as he could muster, and his little feet stomping back and

forth...all before he ran across the room and threw himself face down into the couch and cried. It was time to share...and he wasn't having any of it.

It's normal. Sharing is hard. As we get older, we usually trade literally clenching our fists and stomping our feet for metaphorically doing these things...usually. But it doesn't always get easier.

"But it's not stewardship season, Pastor Rhonda, why are we talking about sharing?" Well, that may or may not be true, but it is true that the kind of sharing I am talking about is less about clenching our fists in anger and maybe more about clenching our fists in fear.

You would probably not be surprised to hear that Christians are sharing their faith less. Interestingly, the percentage of Christians who think it is their responsibility to share their faith has gone up and is much higher than the percentage of Christians who actually do share their faith.

Part of this is, I'm sure, due to the fact that many of us are taught from a very early age that religion is a taboo topic for polite society. It could also stem from cultural, religious, and familial traditions. But for whatever reason, the general trend tells us that we struggle to share our faith with others.

But what if we did? What would it look like? Some of us were able to practice sharing different parts of our faith story in adult faith formation in January. It was fun to answer questions about why we come to church, where we first went to church, what our religious traditions might have been as a child. It was fun...and we learned a lot about people we thought we already knew pretty well.

The world we live in is filled with a lot of things that make us feel frustrated, hopeless, and angry. We talk about the news, politics, and a whole host of other things on a daily basis with family, friends, and co-workers that often leave us feeling overwhelmed.



What if we started to have more conversations about our faith, our church, and our faith community...even little ones...on a more regular basis? What would it look like? What effect might it have?

Uh-Oh, is she talking about evangelism? Yes...but not in the sense of trying to convert or get people to come to church, the scary kind of evangelism. It is the kind of evangelism that just wants to share part of the story that lifts us and fills us in our own lives. What if we told someone about the great worship service or event that our church just had? What if we shared about a servant project or organization that our church just worked with? What if we shared a God moment with someone outside of church circles?

I can only imagine if Christians everywhere made a conscious effort to have more of these simple conversations about this thing that is so important in our lives...our faith and our church.

Salem friends, our church is a vibrant, living, loving community full of people of great faith. We have a wonderful worship tradition and fun and meaningful events that help us to live into our identity as followers of Jesus...why wouldn't we want to share a little bit about it with the people in our lives?

Our challenge this year is to SHARE. Now...go...share...make a difference!


Adult Faith Formation

Grief Groups Meeting at SpringHouse


