Worship Technically

Second, we have deduced that a majority of the issues might be due to the stream not being "live" until 9:30 am. (If people try to connect before it is "live" they will have trouble.) We think we have figured out a fix for this. We will be trying something new this Sunday (11/1) and hope to see if those who have reported issues may connect without trouble. After this weekend's adjustments, we will find out if there are still issues and work to fix them.



Third, we want to make sure you have the <u>best way to connect to the live stream.</u>
These simple steps will help resolve some connection issues:

- Go to the <u>Salem English Lutheran Church YouTube site</u>.
 If you need help getting there, go to our website at www.discoversalem.org and click on the words "CLICK HERE" in the middle left of the page.
- 2. You will be taken to the Salem English Lutheran YouTube site. Please BOOKMARK it on your device.
- When it is time for worship-simply go to your BOOKMARKS and click on the Salem YouTube site.
- 4. Once on the Salem YouTube site, you will see all of our previous livestreams by date, starting with the most recent. At the very top/front of the list will be the current days date.
- 5. Click on the current day and you will be taken to the "live" live stream.

Finally, we want to make sure that you are letting us know when you have tech issues. Scott Rusten (resident tech guy) is more than willing to answer questions via email or phone...and even is willing to make a house call if needed. From getting to the right site to setting up worship on your TV, he's your guy!)





In the months churches have spent worshiping online instead in beloved worship spaces, the question has been posed by some; "Does church matter if we can't gather together?"



Eleven SpringHouse Board members clergy participated September 28 Zoom board meeting. Highlights of the meeting included the following:



- A new boiler has been installed, but it is not yet operational. A new part is on order. The HVAC replacement was approved. (October update: the boiler is working)
- The heating system can now be run on an "unoccupied" mode in order to save on costs and be more efficient.
- The Insurance Committee received three bids for insurance coverage for SH. The bid from Church Mutual was finally approved in a follow-up email meeting by the board.
- Co-chair Rae Buzzell led an open-ended discussion of concerns for the 2021 SH budget, especially in light of the drop in income from rental groups.
- The annual SpringHouse Board budgeting meeting is scheduled for November 8.

Zoom House Delivers Hope this Season

An update from ZOOM House President Cyndi McDurmott

This year has been especially difficult for the ZOOM House organization and its residents. COVID-19 has negatively impacted our fundraising efforts, particularly with the transition of the annual gala to an online-only event, and has caused hardship for our ZOOM House residents, at least 30% of whom were either furloughed or laid off, leaving them to struggle with securing food and paying rent. The community was extremely generous and contributed items to assist in sustaining our residents.

The unrest in our community and the challenges our country faces today have further complicated this very difficult time. ZOOM House is in the heart of the area where the demonstrations and disruption took place after the death of George Floyd.

The ZOOM House staff continues to meet with residents on an individual basis to ensure their needs are being met. Despite the challenges this year, we had two residents transition out of ZOOM House to their own homes. Residents remain positive and productive.

Your support this year is more important than ever. Unemployment rates continue to be high as a result of COVID-19, and residents will continue to struggle financially. Individual contributions from our ZOOM community of donors account for about 25% of annual revenue. ZOOM House success is highly dependent on your generous donations!



If you haven't colored your part of the BIG mosaic picture and sent it back to SpringHouse in the stamped envelope, please do—we want to see what this big picture looks like!


